Focusing on education, Joe Hobbs will present a session with the Newman Smith drumline, covering warm-ups and the concept of "breaking down" show music. Coming back for an encore of last year's highly successful presentation, John Wooten and friends will again present an interactive clinic on visuals and stick tricks.

At PASIC 2015, the popularity of marching percussion will be proudly on display. We are extremely fortunate this year to have not one, but two presentations from world-class drum corps percussion sections: Colin McNutt and Iain Moyer with The Cadets, and Paul and Sandi Rennick with Santa Clara Vanguard. CONCERT SESSION: THE OLD GUARD FIFE AND DRUM CORPS AND THE BRITISH MARINES DRUM SECTION

We invite you to a historic concert in which two of the world's premier musical organizations will come together showcasing the global connection of military music. The United States Army "Old Guard" Fife and Drum Corps recalls the days of the American Revolution as they perform in uniforms patterned after those worn by the musicians of General George Washington's Continental Army. The Old Guard blends traditional American fife and drum music with modern-day arranging techniques, providing the performers and audience members a truly unique experience.

The traditional sound of Her Majesty's Royal Marines Corps of Drums is often heard during the beating of retreat in London. Their beautiful display of traditional British bugling and drumming has captivated audiences around the world. The Royal Marines began their service

JOHN WOOTON AND THE FLAM FIVE

They will perform their composition from last year, "What The Heck Were We Thinking," as well as some new material, and they possibly may have some special guests. JOE HOBBS AND THE NEWMAN SMITH HIGH SCHOOL PERCUSSION SECTION

This clinic was inspired by experiences shared by many first-year teachers. The daily band class schedule can include a certain amount of designated rehearsal time, and it is important to determine a way to rehearse the pit and the battery simultaneously.



Knowing each section needs to build and develop specific skill sets, it is possible to create a warm-up routine to suit the needs of both sections at once. After quite a bit of trial and error, and a few years of revisions, this warm-up sequence emerged and helped immensely in the overall success of the Newman Smith program.

The clinic will feature the entire warm-up sequence and explain how to implement this in your current percussion curriculum. Each exercise will cover a basic skill set for every instrument in the percussion ensemble.

THE CADETS/SANTA CLARA VANGUARD

Using music from their 2015 competitive shows, the battery and front ensemble sections of these outstanding drum and bugle corps will demonstrate rehearsal techniques, designs, and musical approaches that help them achieve such high performance quality.
